Developed the simulation module using full system GEMS-Simics simulation framework. Extended the timing-only model of the GEMS framework to support data value logging for multi-versioning in the different caches of a TM system. Employed the “Magic” no-ops in Simics for defining new instructions to interface with the decoupled hardware primitives. Used the GEMS SLICC language to specify the complete TMESI cache protocol (including the transient states) under directory and snooping based systems.
